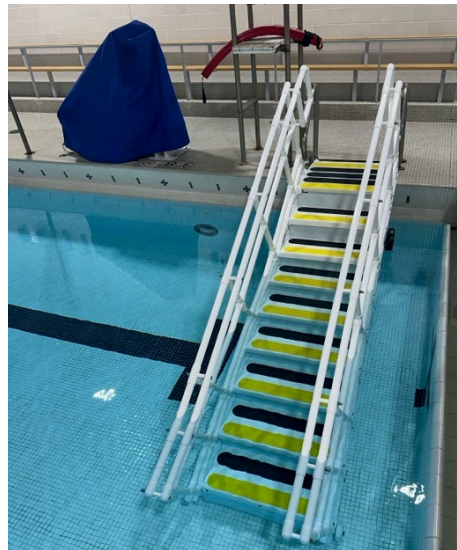

Greetings from the office of the Superintendent!

Spring is upon us and this means many things to many different people. Spring sports are in the middle of a busy schedule, farmers are anticipating getting in the fields and seniors and their families are having discussions about graduation plans. Please continue to pay special attention to our daily announcements, website and social media accounts for the ever changing spring schedules.

While we have some time remaining in the 23-24 school year, there is ongoing planning for the 24-25 school year. One item that still needs clarification is our professional development needs due to state requirements in the science of reading. Last year the state passed legislation for schools to comply with a series of requirements. A major portion of those requirements focuses on professional development for our teaching staff, which focuses on the science of reading. While we feel our staff do great work in this area, there is always room for improvement.

We wanted to bring your attention to the possible calendar changes that may occur due to professional development requirements mandated by the state. These changes are essential to ensure that our faculty and staff are equipped with the necessary tools and knowledge to provide the best possible education to our students. Our hope is that we can provide much of the professional development time during existing teacher inservice, days but we are still awaiting the final PD schedule. When this happens, the district will determine if any slight changes need to be made to the school calendar for 2024-25.

We understand that any modifications to the calendar can impact your schedule and routines, and we appreciate your flexibility and understanding. Rest assured that we will strive to minimize disruptions as much as possible while complying with the state regulations. Any changes to the calendar will be communicated across all of our avenues (school messaging, Facebook, and school website).

If you have any concerns or need further clarification on the upcoming calendar changes, please do not hesitate to reach out to me. Your cooperation and support are greatly valued as we work together to create a successful end to the school year.

The end of the school is also the culmination for many of our Huskers. For our seniors, it is the end of 13 years of time spent here at Holdingford School. Graduation is a truly great time for these young adults as well as their families who have supported them through it all. While the end is in sight for these individuals, I urge them to put their best foot forward in the remaining weeks but also take time to enjoy their final weeks with classmates, staff, and friends. It goes by in a blink of an eye, so do your best to slow it down and take it in.

ISD #738 Holdingford Public School School Board Filing Dates

The school district will have a special election on the ballot this November for a candidate to fill the last year of a four-year term. The period for filing affidavits of candidacy for the office of school board member will begin on July 30, 2024 and close on August 13th, 2024. An affidavit of candidacy must be filed in the office of the school district clerk (900 5th St. Holdingford, MN 56340 enter door #3) and the \$2 filing fee paid prior to 5:00 o'clock p.m. on August 13th, 2024.

Candidate Qualifications are:

- must be eligible to vote in Minnesota
- must have not filed for another office at the upcoming primary or general election
- must be 21 years of age or more upon assuming office
- must have maintained residence in their district for at least 30 days before the general election
- must have not been convicted of an offense for which they are required to register as a predatory offender under Minnesota Statute 243.166

The general election will be held on Tuesday, November 5th, 2024. At that election, one member will be elected to the School Board for a term of one (1) year. The voting will take place in connection with the general election at all polling places within the territory of Independent School District No. 738 located in Stearns and Morrison County, Minnesota.

Summer EBT

During the summer of 2024, Minnesota plans to introduce Summer EBT, a fresh initiative offering grocery benefits. This program will furnish families with \$120 per eligible school-aged child, aiding them in purchasing groceries when school is not in session. Summer often poses challenges for families as children lose access to meals provided at school, necessitating additional support for meal provision. While most families will receive these benefits automatically, some parents may need to apply.

Benefits of Summer EBT:

- Helps parents and caregivers buy healthy foods for their children.
- Gives families the flexibility to select foods that fit their culture and lifestyle.
- Improves food security and diet quality for participating children.

How Summer EBT Works:

The benefits will be provided on a separate EBT card, and can be used to buy groceries. Families will receive \$120 per eligible child for the summer. Benefits can be used at authorized retailers, like grocery stores and farmers markets, to purchase healthy foods like fruits, vegetables, meats and other protein sources, whole grains, and dairy. Children and teens need healthy food year-round to play, grow, and learn. Summer EBT will help families stretch their grocery budget during the summer and provide their children with the nutrition they need to thrive.

Eligibility:

Children are eligible for the program if:

- the household already participates in SNAP, MFIP, FDPIR, Tribal TANF, Medicaid, and/or Foster Care, OR
- the child attends a school that offers the National School Lunch or School Breakfast Program and the household income meets the requirements for free or reduced-price school meals.

Enrollment:

Many families will get Summer EBT automatically if they are getting other benefits, but some families may need to apply.

- If the household already participates in SNAP, MFIP, FDPIR, Tribal TANF, Medicaid, and/or Foster Care, they will be automatically enrolled in the Summer EBT program. Households do not need to fill out an application.
- If the household is not automatically enrolled and may be eligible, they can get Summer EBT by filling out an application for educational benefits by visiting our food service website at www.isd738.org and then clicking on District Services - >Food Services - >Free/Reduced Application.

Notes from the Nurse's Office

□ Look Out! □

Please watch for email communication coming home in May to families of students who will be entering 7th and 12th grade as well as any students who are missing any required immunizations. This communication will include what required immunizations your student may be missing, will need for 24/25 enrollment, and exemption information should you choose this route.

□ Inhalers □ Bee Sting Allergies □

As the temperatures continue to warm, we will start seeing environmental elements cause possible allergic and asthmatic reactions. If your child uses an inhaler, please make sure he/she has it in their backpack and/or the nurse's office to be able to use it if needed. Bees will also start to make their way to our school. If your child has a bee sting allergy, please make sure your child's care plan (EpiPen or not) is up to date in the event they would get stung.

□ PreK-6 Students □

Please make sure your child has an extra set of clean, dry clothes in his/her backpack, cubby, or locker in the event mud/water puddles find them. Please include a pair of pants (switch them out for shorts as the weather gets warmer), socks, underwear, and a shirt.

□ Prescription Medication Return - End of School Year □

If at any time during the school year your child has taken prescription medication (including PRN medication) at school, please contact one of the nurses to establish a means of transportation home before the last day of school. If you have a student who has an EpiPen, inhaler, and/or emergency medication they may need available to them until the end of the school year, those will be sent home on the last day of school unless other arrangements have been made. Communication will be emailed in early May to those who have not contacted one of the nurses to determine how to transport leftover medications home.

□ Spring Safety Tips □

- Make outdoor playtime a safe time -- your children should wear helmets when riding bikes, skateboards, and scooters. Knee pads and elbow pads are easy additions for extra protection.
- Drink plenty of water, especially as plans include more outdoor activities.
- As the trees and flowers begin to (finally!) bloom, so will poison ivy. Check the areas around your home and teach your kids to recognize and avoid it.
- Stinging insects are back -- if you are stung, remove the stinger as soon as possible with a scraping motion. Wash with soap and water and apply a cold compress. If you experience trouble breathing, severe swelling, or fainting, call 911 immediately.
- Ticks will be out and about before we know it. Use tweezers or fingers to grasp as close to the head as possible and pull the tick away from where it is attached. Call the doctor for symptoms of a rash or fever.

Kindergarten Orientation and Open House

The kindergarten team is incredibly excited to be teaching your kindergarten child this upcoming school year! Entering kindergarten is a special milestone for your child and we want you and your child to feel as comfortable and prepared as possible for a great start to the year. Here is the kindergarten schedule for the beginning of the 2024-2025 school year.

Kindergarten students and their parents will get to meet their child's teacher and bring **ALL** of their school supplies to Open House night on Wednesday, August 28th.

In addition to Open House, we will also be hosting Kindergarten Orientation during the first two days of school. The kindergarten students' first official day of school will be Thursday, September 5th. Families will receive an email from Sign-Up Genius at the beginning of August and can choose a morning or afternoon time slot to meet with their child's kindergarten teacher on Tuesday, September 3rd or Wednesday, September 4th. Please plan on being at school for the full 2 hours. The deadline for signing-up for your orientation time is August 14th. During your orientation time, the kindergarten teachers will be sharing their hopes, dreams, and expectations for the school year. 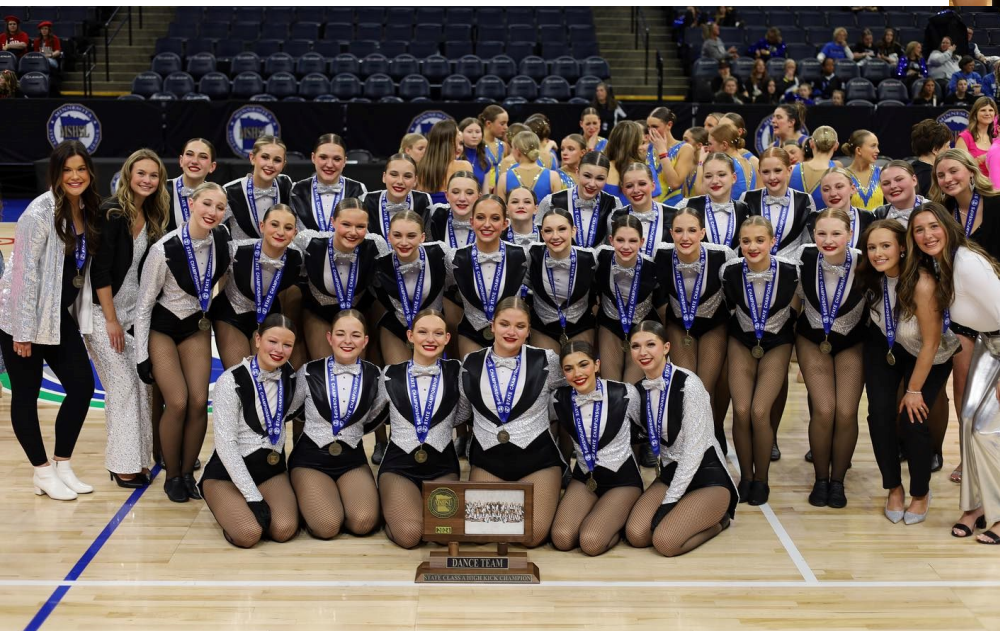

We then had another scrimmage in Duluth, MN against Duluth Marshall. We played very well early on in the season. We then played in the Granite City Classic at the end of December against a top ranked A school in Hancock and a top-ranked AA school in Pequot Lakes. We lost to Hancock and beat Pequot Lakes. We then played in the Breakdown Crossover Classic against Perham and lost by 8 points. We played really well for the rest of the season with our only losses during the regular season to Hancock, Albany, Sauk Centre, and Perham. Our regular season ended with a 22-4 record.

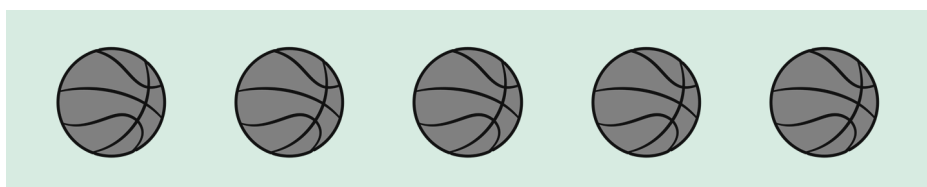

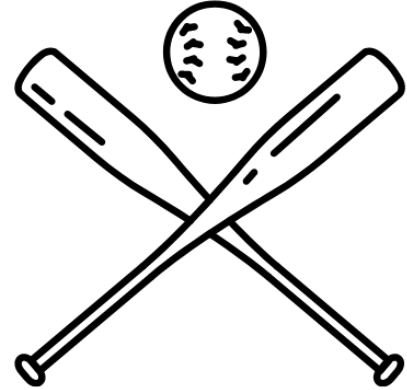

Screening at 3.5 is preferred, but a child may be screened between the ages of 3 and the start of Kindergarten as required by law.

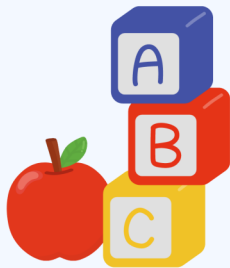
What to expect at a screening appointment?
